TOP RULES FOR ELECTRICAL SAFETY



DON'T EVER CLIMB A FENCE AROUND AN ELECTRICAL SUBSTATION:

If a ball or pet gets inside the fence, ask a grown-up to call the electric company—they'll come and get it out for you.



FLY YOUR KITE FAR AWAY FROM POWER LINES OR SUBSTATIONS:

The kite and the string may conduct electricity—sending it right through you to the ground.



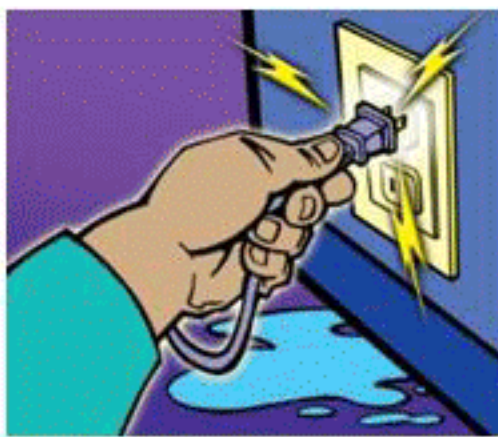
NEVER CLIMB A TREE WITH POWER LINES RUNNING THROUGH THEM:

You could get electrocuted!



NEVER STICK YOUR FINGER OR ANY OBJECTS INSIDE AN ELECTRICAL OUTLET:

You could get a severe shock or even cause a more serious injury or get electrocuted.



WATER AND ELECTRICITY DON'T MIX:

If you touch electricity that is touching water then you may get shocked or electrocuted. This is true for all liquids not just water.



NEVER STICK AN ITEM INTO AN ELECTRICAL APPLIANCE:

If your food gets stuck in a toaster or other electrical appliance, first unplug the appliance, then call an adult to remove the food item.
